Harbour Launch Refit - The Good News / Bad News situation continued from May into June. The only difference is the subject matter. The good news is that Dave managed to cut all of the holes in the steel deck plate and give or take 1 or 2 millimetres the dry fit went like a dream. The not so good news this month relates to the main port side longitudinal

beam or carlin. This has been subjected to prolonged water penetration and has rotted. The photo over left shows the residue



after Geoff had been busy with drills, chisels and brute force. It was just a pity he hadn't bothered to cover up the batteries

first they were well and truly at the bottom of the heap. The photo on the right shows the hole left after removing the rotten wood. The damage goes right through the forward bulkhead into the forward cabin so the 12 Foot replacement will be quite interesting as the finished repair needs to retain the strength

20 Foot Cutter - The engine needs to serviced and restored before it can be fitted back into the hull. Work held pending completion of current work load.
