were in the process of fitting it. This was only the third time he had put it down and lost it. Promise us you will buck up in future Alan.





Allan 2 and Tony carried on with refitting the engine. Below left is Allan 2 giving it a coat of green gloss, (what other colour would a 'greeny' use.?) After that the two intrepids' fitted the new injectors, alternator and Starter Motor. During this work Allan 2 found the

manufacturer's build tally on the engine. It was built in 1933. This makes the engine older than most of the volunteers. The only difference is the engine still works or would do if our resident butcher had spent more time watching what he was doing with the starter motor rather than thinking about mincing beef, filleting a pork loin or cutting lamb chops. HSL 102 - Responsibility for this boat is being transferred from this group. Work package / handover in the month subject to Boat Committee.

MGB 81 - Responsibility for this boat is being transferred from this group. Work package / handover in the month subject to Boat Committee.

Crew Training - Hopefully to be set up in the coming weeks / months to be completed before next season Ariadne - Figure head refit on hold until further notice. Osborne - Weekly checks on state of boat and surrounding stand.

25 Foot Motor Launch Ark Royal - Finish the small covers and agree the display format and location.

Admiralty Pattern 14 Ft. - Work held pending completion of current work load.

32 Foot Rowing Cutter - Keep a watching brief on her now she is held in the tunnel in a holding condition. **Landing Craft** - Fit some low volume pumps with batteries and solar panel similar to Cyclops (subject to Boat Committee approval depending on remaining time left on the Mast Pond). Improve access with a temporary deck enhancement.

20 Foot Clinker Sea-boat - The engine needs to serviced and restored before it can be fitted back into the hull. Work held pending completion of current work load.

15 Foot Fast Motor Boat - . Currently on hold Main Pontoon - Construct a power stanchion to

incorporate the twin solar panels.
